HOW?

- social inclusion as "society for all"
- social inclusion is the process of improving the terms on which individuals and groups take part in society—improving the ability, opportunity, and dignity of those disadvantaged on the basis of their identity*
- inclusive society ensures participation of citizens with different capabilities and opportunities, restrictions and needs
- provides for dignity, respect of human rights, distinct identity and belonging to a community, nation, state







Transformations through collaborations






- Transformation is rooted in collaboration between nonusual partners, diverse groups of actors /players
- Collaborations are based on trust and building bridges between non-similar actors /players
- For trust, players need to understand each other: use common language, or invent a new language:
 - e.g. change-makers, reinventing universities, challenge, innovation ecosystems, new paradigm etc.
- For trustworthy communication, players need to have safe space where they can express themselves freely

- Responsible decision-making




